

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Crewe: Archaeological Statement

1 Archaeological Potential

1.1 The conclusion from the Assessment of Crewe is that given the dispersed, pre-industrial settlement pattern of the town and pending a systematic survey of its industrial remains, an Area of Archaeological Potential is impractical and inappropriate to define. The archaeological potential of the town will therefore be considered in terms of sites identified in the County Sites and Monuments Record.

Scheduled Ancient Monuments	One – Moated site and fishpond north east of Wood Farm (SAM 30360)
Listed Buildings	Grade II - 30
Conservation Areas	One – Crewe Green
Registered Parks and Gardens	Two – Queens Park (Number 4146, Grade II) and Crewe Hall (Number 1020, Grade II)
