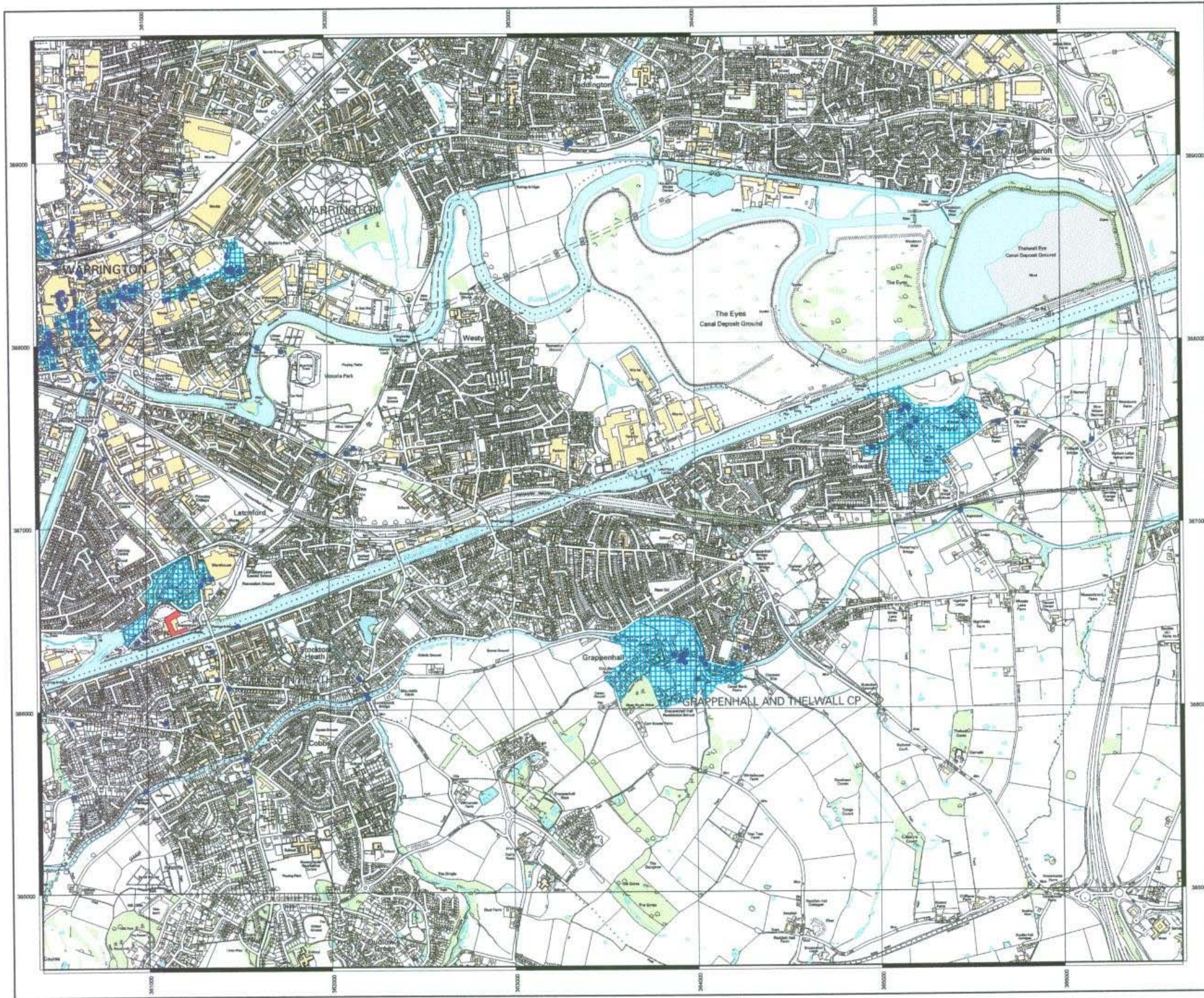
# Thelwall: Archaeological Statement

## 1 Archaeological Potential

- 1.1 The conclusion from the Archaeological Assessment of Thelwall is that given the dispersed settlement pattern of the town, an Area of Archaeological Potential is both impractical and inappropriate to define. The archaeological potential of the town will therefore be considered in terms of sites identified in the County Sites and Monuments Record.
